CLASS 150 – Horse of the Year Show Qualifier 2011 & NHSCS Qualifier - Small Hunter - mare or gelding 4 yrs old & over exceeding 148cms (14.2hh) & not exceeding 158cms (15.2hh). Riders to have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January 2011.

CLASS 151 - Horse of the Year Show Qualifier 2011 & NHSCS Qualifier - Lightweight Hunter - mare or gelding 4 yrs old & over capable of carrying up to 12 stone 7lbs (79.5 kgs).

CLASS 152- Horse of the Year Show Qualifier 2011 & NHSCS Qualifier - Middleweight Hunter - mare or gelding 4 yrs old & over capable of carrying 12 stone 7lbs (79.5 kgs) and not exceeding 14 stone (89kgs).

CLASS 153 – Horse of the Year Show Qualifier 2011 & NHSCS Qualifier - Heavyweight Hunter - mare or gelding 4 yrs old & over capable of carrying over 14 stone (89kgs).

In the lightweight, middleweight, heavyweight and small hunter classes, the highest placed unqualified horse in the first four will qualify to enter at the HOYS. No horse lower than fourth will qualify.

CLASS 168 - Novice Working Hunter – Qualifier for Lincolnshire Agricultural Society's 'Robert Goffin Working Hunter Championship' - Mare, gelding or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) 4 yrs old & over exceeding 148cms (14.2hh), not having won a total of £200 (excluding championship prize money) in working hunter classes, or more than 25 British Eventing points or £200 BSJA show jumping before 1st January 2011 (or equivalent values).

Working Hunters should initially be called in and lined up in random order. Working Hunters may complete 'Hors Concours' in Novice Working Hunter Classes in the jumping phase only at the discretion of the show secretary but the horse cannot compete in any other Working Hunter classes for the duration of that show.

Working Hunters may complete 'Hors Concours' in Novice Working Hunter Classes in the jumping phase only at the discretion of the show secretary but the horse cannot compete in any other Working Hunter classes for the duration of that show.

OPEN RIDDEN COBS

**Judge: Mr A Mickleburgh, Altrincham (conformation)
& Miss K Sears, Oswestry (ride)**

These classes are held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the Association and all Owners, Exhibitors and Riders must be Association members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Classes 173 & 174 are qualifiers for Horse of the Year show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified, the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified, the third will go forward and so forth to fifth place. In accordance with BSHA rules the annual BSHA HOYS fee of £15 must have been paid to BSHA **before** the entry is made if the exhibitor wishes to qualify. The BSHA HOYS fee cannot be paid in retrospect. This fee is not the HOYS levy, which goes to Grandstand Media Ltd.

Horses competing in the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain Classes at their affiliated shows cannot compete in Hack and Riding Horse classes at the same show.

The three highest placed winners in all open affiliated classes will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic Supreme Classes at the National Championship Show on September 9th & 10th 2011.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Amateur and Young Rider rosette in each open class and a championship rosette for each section.

Virbac Animal Health, manufacturers of leading wormer brands Equimax and Eraquell, will issue the HOYS Cob qualifier in each class a qualification rosette and card, this will not be presented in the ring but will be forwarded along with confirmation of qualification from the BSHA.

CLASS 172 - Novice Ridden Cob (Show) - Mare or Gelding 4 yrs old & over exceeding 148 cms but not exceeding 155 cms. Not to have won a 1st prize of £25 or more, or more than a total of £100 in any show cob classes which were affiliated to the Association, at home or abroad prior to 1st January 2011. Winnings gained as a 4 yr old are exempt unless that 4 yr old has won an Open Ridden Class. A novice may be shown in a snaffle bridle. Non-members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 day tickets per exhibitor, per horse, per season. A day ticket will allow entry into novice, amateur, young rider, home produced, working and open affiliated classes only but will **not** allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes. Horses registered on a day ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can purchase a day ticket from the BSHA office. Special 111 - SUPREME IN HAND CHAMPIONSHIP – The Young Ideas Trophy and the N.P.S. Kilmannan Stud Mountain and Moorland In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be judged by Mrs A Dale.

In addition, the Champion will receive a voucher for a pair of Muck Boot Tack Classic Boots (rrp £61) kindly donated by Belstane

To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the NPS for the best registered pony owned by an NPS member in the M&M In Hand Section. The Sponsor's rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the Qualification Card. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the Owner of the Champion pony is not a Member, or the Owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Rosette Championships.

All exhibitors are reminded that they compete at their own risk and that they should have legal liability insurance.

REGULATIONS FOR THE SOCIETY'S SHOW

1. All exhibits must be bona-fide property of the exhibitor and carry the correct number.
2. The judge's decision shall be final and the Council reserves the right to withhold any prizes if, in the opinion of the judges, the exhibits do not possess sufficient merit.
3. **All prize money will be paid to the person in whose name the exhibit is entered and shown in the catalogue as the exhibitor/owner. Prize money will be allocated as follows - 4 or less entries = 2nd prize, 5-6 entries = 3rd prize, 7 & over entries = 4th prize, 10-20 entries = 5th prize, 20-25 entries = 6th prize. Prize money may be paid out on the day at the times displayed on the Secretary's caravan otherwise it will be posted. Any uncollected prize money will be posted. Please note prize money will not be paid out until 1 hour after a class has ended.**
4. The Society reserves the right to alter the schedule at its discretion or to merge classes if there are insufficient exhibitors. Entry fees will be refunded for any event cancelled.
5. Any exhibitor wishing to lodge a protest in respect of any animal exhibited at the show in the light horse section must do so in writing within 60 minutes of completion of the class together with a deposit of £20. This sum shall be forfeited if, on investigation by the Council, the protest is not sustained.
6. The Council will not hold itself responsible for any loss or accident whatsoever which may occur on the showground and all entries shall be deemed to have been made on this understanding.
7. Acknowledgement of entry forms, together with the necessary tickets, will be sent by the Secretary to enable exhibitors to check their entries have been received. If you do not receive this acknowledgement at least 7 days before the show, please contact the Light Horse Secretary.
8. Competitors are requested to take particular note of the times of their classes and to be ready in the collecting ring.
9. The Society reserves the right to have measured any horse or pony where there is a height stipulation and where certificates issued under the Joint Measurement Scheme cannot be produced as evidence of height. Where applicable, competitors may also be requested to produce birth certificates as proof of age.
10. All foals must be at least 3 weeks old. Stallions and colts 2 yrs old or over must hold a Ministry of Agriculture, Breed Society or NPS Stallion licence, unless otherwise governed by their individual breed society. All handlers of stallions and colts 2 yrs old and over must be 14 yrs old or over.
11. The Ridden Hunter Classes are affiliated to The Sports Horse Breeding of Great Britain. The SHB(GB) require all entries in the Ridden Hunter classes to be entered on their basic identity register or stud book and on 2011 show hunter

register.

- 1 The Basic identity register is a one off lifetime register & the costs are:
 - A) Foal £25 (basic identity)
 - B) Older Horses £25 (basic identity)
 - C) Overstamp of any other society's recognised passport £25
 - D) Temporary show hunter day ticket £12, must be on SHB(GB) basic identity register to qualify. Allowed 3 per season.
- 2 The only annual registration is for horses competing in a ridden qualifying class which is currently £47 for the horse and £52 for the owner & rider.

12. Mountain and Moorland in hand ponies must be registered with their respective breed society to be eligible to compete & registration numbers must be stated on the entry form.

13. The pony's breed society registration number must be stated when entering Heritage classes.

14. This show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society Ref No BSPS 44/11 and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in the BPS classes whether or not members of the BPS are subject to the constitution and rules of the BPS including the disciplinary procedures and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BPS.

This show is a qualifier for the BPS Championship Show 2011. The 1st and 2nd prize winners from the Nursery stakes & WHP, 1st, 2nd, 3rd from the Cradle Stakes, Heritage and INT classes, & 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th from the mixed height SHP and WHP classes will qualify provided the pony is owned and registered in accordance with rules 23 and 28 and ridden by a BPS member.

This is a qualifying show for the "BPS Premier League", the 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th placed ponies in the Cradle stakes, Nursery stakes and Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden and ridden WHP classes and SHP and WHP classes will qualify.

This show is a qualifier for the BPS "Classic Security (UK) Ltd" challenge. The higher placed pony in the Cradle Stakes and Nursery Stakes, WHP & SHP & Heritage classes that has not qualified for the 2011 Horse of the Year Show, in the appropriate HOYS class, will qualify. If the highest placed pony has already qualified the qualification will be awarded to the next eligible pony.

The Best Rider in the Cradle stakes, Nursery stakes, WHP, SHP and Heritage classes where the rider has not attained their 25th birthday, will be awarded a best rider card and will qualify for the BPS "Black Country Saddles" Rider of the Year final at the Summer Championships Show.

15. Classes 172-179 are held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the association and all owners, exhibitors, and riders must be association members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older.

Non-members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 day tickets per exhibitor, per horse, per season. A day ticket will allow entry into Novice, Amateur, Young

Rider, Home Produced, Working and Open affiliated classes only but will not allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes. Horses registered on a day ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can purchase a day ticket from the BSHA office.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Amateur and Young Rider Rosette in each open class and a championship rosette for each section.

16. In the Private Driving classes, all horses and ponies to be 4 yrs old and older. The grooms/passengers on competing turnouts must have attained their 11th birthday on the day of the show. In the event that a driver is under 18, he or she must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent and responsible person aged 18 or over, who must remain with the vehicle at all times whilst the vehicle is moving. Proof of age will be required in the event of a query. BDS members only may take part & it is recommended in the interests of safety that all entries carry a responsible passenger.

17. Classes 187 and 188 are affiliated to Veteran Horse Showing Limited and are Olympia area qualifiers. The highest placed horses within the following age groups will qualify - Pre Veteran 15-19 yrs old, Veteran 20-24 yrs old, Veteran Plus 25 yrs old and over. The Veteran Horse Showing Ltd Olympia Area Qualifiers are open to both members and non members of the Veteran Horse Showing/Society. Please note all competitors should acquaint themselves with the rules of the VHS, they can be found at www.veteran-horse-showing.co.uk. Only VHS members are eligible to compete in the regional championship. Qualification cards will only be given to the first 3 members with their VHS membership/horse registration card/covering letter from the Show office. The regional winners will go on to compete at the Veteran Horse Showing Limited Championship Supreme Final at the London International Horse Show at Olympia in December.

No foals, spurs, galloping or wearing of ear-rings permitted

Minimum age of handler for veteran in hand classes is 9 yrs, minimum age of handlers for stallions is 16 yrs

18. If late entries are accepted, double the entry fee will be charged, in accordance with the terms and conditions shown under the entry rules listed in this schedule

19. In the interests of safety it is strongly recommended that protective headgear should be worn by all handlers. Anyone aged 14 or under must wear protective headgear.
